

Town scores top marks for its food

TWO Tenbury food businesses have been recognised with a top rating for providing a high level of hygiene and health and safety.

Restaurant Whites@Clockhouse and Elgar Foods, Bromyard Road, received five stars from Malvern Hills District Council as part of a Scores on the Doors initiative.

In a Herefordshire and Worcestershire-wide initiative, food businesses within the Malvern Hills District have been checked and scored by the local environmental

health team. Businesses are then given a certificate to display with their rating.

Although the scheme was launched in the district earlier this year, the aftermath of last summer's floods meant Tenbury inspections were put on hold.

Stephanie Ingram, of Malvern Hills commercial services, said: "The scheme will act as an incentive for businesses to achieve the highest possible standards of hygiene by rewarding the

best with the public recognition they deserve."

Tenbury district councillor Phil Grove said: "To have two of our local food companies receive the highest rating as part of this new initiative demonstrates that Tenbury is well on the road to recovery from the flooding last year. It also highlights that this town has some excellent businesses in its midst."

He added: "We can look forward to seeing more companies in Tenbury achieving a five star rating in the future."
